## Sir Gaerfyrddin Fforwm Ifanc

### **Addewid Hawliau Plant**

Mae plant ledled Sir Gaerfyrddin yn cael addewid y bydd eu hawliau'n cael eu hanrhydeddu a'u hystyried wrth i benderfyniadau gael eu gwneud.

Fe wnaethom ni cwrdd â uwch gynghorwyr a swyddogion, er mwyn llofnodi adduned a fydd yn sicrhau bod y Cyngor yn cyrraedd safonau gofynnol wrth wneud penderfyniadau sy'n effeithio ar fywydau plant a phobl ifanc.

Fe wnaeth y Cyng. Emlyn Dole, yr Aelod o'r Bwrdd Gweithredol dros Addysg y Cyng. Gareth Jones, y Prif Weithredwr Mark James, y Cyfarwyddwr Addysg a Gwasanaethau Plant Rob Sully, a ein Cadeirydd, Brittany Alsop-Bingham oll lofnodi'r addewid cyn Diwrnod Hawliau Plant, 20 Tachwedd.

Mae hefyd yn golygu y bydd pobl ifanc hyfforddedig yn craffu ar benderfyniadau'n flynyddol.

Fe'i mabwysiadwyd gan y Cyngor Sir y llynedd ac mae wedi bod yn flaenoriaeth strategol ers hynny, gyda strategaeth a chynllun gweithredu tair blynedd yn cael eu datblygu.

Roedd yn cynnwys sefydlu tîm Cyfranogiad a Hawliau Plant newydd, Cyngor Ieuenctid Sir Gaerfyrddin sy'n tyfu a mwy o gyfleoedd i bobl ifanc fod yn rhan o brosesau penderfynu yn lleol ac yn genedlaethol.

### **Cynhadledd Ieuenctid**

Mae pobl ifanc o Sir Gaerfyrddin gyfan wedi rhoi eu barn ar yr hyn sy'n bwysig iddynt er mwyn helpu i lunio dyfodol y sir.

Fe wnaeth ein Gynhadledd Ieuenctid eleni rhoi'r gyfle iddynt rannu eu barn am iechyd a lles, gan gyfrannu at gynllun llesiant Sir Gaerfyrddin a gynhyrchir gan y Bwrdd Gwasanaethau Cyhoeddus newydd.

Mae llesiant yn cwmpasu addysg, yr amgylchedd, diogelwch, iechyd, swyddi, yr economi a'r holl faterion sy'n cyfrannu at allu pobl ifanc i fod yn hapus, yn iach ac yn llwyddiannus.

Cynhaliwyd nifer o weithdai yn ystod y gynhadledd ac roedd aelodau o'r Bwrdd Gwasanaethau Cyhoeddus yn bresennol i roi cyngor ac i dderbyn adborth.

Dywedodd ein Cadeirydd, Brittany Bingham: "Gobeithio y bydd Deddf Cenedlaethau'r Dyfodol yn cael dylanwad, nid yn unig ar Gymru heddiw ond ar fywydau pob cenedlaeth a ddaw ar ein holau yn Sir Gaerfyrddin.

Dywedodd y Cynghorydd Gareth Jones, yr Aelod o'r Bwrdd Gweithredol dros Wasanaethau Ieuenctid: "Bydd adborth o'r Gynhadledd Ieuenctid yn bwydo i'n cynllun llesiant; mae'n hanfodol bwysig fod safbwyntiau pobl ifanc yn cael eu hystyried wrth wneud penderfyniadau yn y dyfodol."

## **Y fyddin yn herio ymgyrchwyr hawliau plant ac yn dwysau nifer y plant 16 mlwydd oed a dderbynnir**

Mae'r ffigyrau a ryddhawyd heddiw [24 Tachwedd] yn dangos bod Byddin Prydain wedi cynyddu'r nifer o bobl ifanc 16 mlwydd a ymunodd dros y deuddeg mis diwethaf.

Heriodd Byddin Prydain alwadau gan y Cenedloedd Unedig, sefydliadau hawliau plant ac ymgyrchwyr eraill i beidio â recriwtio rhai ifanc gan gynyddu'r nifer sy'n 16 oed a dderbynnir. Rhwng mis Medi 2015 a mis Medi 2016 rhestrodd y Fyddin 1000 o bobl 16 oed, sef 13% o'r cyfanswm, o'i gymharu ag 870 o recriwtiaid 16 oed yn 2014-15. Mae'r polisiau recriwtio a ddefnyddir gan y Fyddin yn datgan bod recriwtio rhai ifanc yn 'rhoi cyfle i liniaru diffygion Mynediad Safonol [oedolion], yn enwedig ar gyfer y Troedfilwyr'. Mae gan y Troedfilwyr y gyfradd farwolaeth ac anafiadau uchaf o unrhyw gangen fawr o'r lluoedd arfog. Mae'r Troedfilwyr yn Afghanistan saith gwaith yn fwy tebygol o gael eu lladd na phersonél sy'n gwasanaethu yng ngweddill lluoedd arfog Prydain.

Ym mis Mehefin 2016, condemniodd Pwyllgor y CU ar Hawliau'r Plant fesurau

diogelu Prydain ar sicrhau cydsyniad ar sail penderfyniad cytbwys recriwtiaid sy'n blant a'u rhieni fel annigonol, ac o ganlyniad galwodd ar y DU i godi oed ymrestru i 18 oed.

Mae pobl ifanc o Sir Fynwy a swyddogion iechyd wedi datblygu gwefan werthfawr yn cynnig cefnogaeth a chyngor i rai sy'n byw gyda hunananafu. Mae'r adnodd newydd - a alwyd yn Buddy - yn diwallu'r angen am safle ar-lein yn cynnig gwybodaeth, arweiniad, dulliau therapiwtig ac opsiynau sydd ar gael i bobl ifanc bob amser. Mae'n rhoi cefnogaeth a thechnegau cyfrinachol i helpu ymdopi gyda meddyliau a theimladau negyddol sy'n gysylltiedig gyda hunananafu ac yn rhoi sicrwydd i'r rhai sy'n cael cyfnod anodd nad ydynt ar ben eu hunain.

Lansiwyd gwefan Buddy yn Ysgol Brenin Harri VIII ddydd Gwener 18 Tachwedd mewn cysylltiad â Diwrnod Rhyngwladol y Dynion a gynhaliwyd y diwrnod dilynol. Thema'r digwyddiad rhyngwladol blynyddol eleni yw Atal Hunanladdiad Gwrywod a'i nod yw codi ymwybyddiaeth o faterion iechyd meddwl sy'n effeithio ar ddynion. Cyflwynodd staff o Wasanaeth Ieuencid Sir Fynwy weithdai i ddisgyblion i ganolbwyntio ar bwysigrwydd siarad am eu teimladau ac effaith iechyd meddwl a hunanladdiad gwrywod.

Mae Buddy yn gobeithio chwalu rhwystrau sy'n gysylltiedig gyda mater sensitif hunananafu a helpu pobl i siarad yn agored, gan eu hysbysu am ffyrdd o ymdopi, yr opsiynau sydd ar gael a chael mynediad i gefnogaeth pan deimlant y gallant wneud hynny. Cynlluniwyd y wefan fel ymateb i gynnydd mewn ymddygiad hunananafu gan bobl ifanc a welwyd gan swyddogion proffesiynol mewn iechyd, addysg a chwrsela mewn blynyddoedd diweddar. Cefnogwyd y wefan gan sefydliad nid-er-elw Heads Above the Waves sy'n codi ymwybyddiaeth o iselder a hunananafu mewn pobl ifanc ac sydd wedi rhoi adroddiadau a straeon personol ar gyfer y safle. ## Participation Standards

### [#ParticipationStandards](#)

The Participation Standards, developed originally by the Participation Unit, have been refreshed by a partnership between Youth Forum workers and Young Wales, informed by consultations with young people.

The Participation Standards can be seen here: [National Participation Standards](#)

The Participation Standards identify the key issues that all workers should be aware of when working with children and young people in Wales. The working group that undertook the work, reviewed each of the seven standards and ensured that each one reflected the rights based ethos that is integral to working with children and young people.

Members of the Participation Standards Task and Finish Group, on behalf of the All Wales Participation Workers Network, are happy to announce the launch of the refreshed 7 National Participation Standards.

*"We would like to stress of the importance of the standards and the explicit link that they now have to the Children's Rights agenda in Wales."*

The launch of the refreshed standards will be followed up with revised guidance on the kite-marking process and the self-assessment tools, for use in Local Authorities, who have an inspection team. Organisations who work with children and young people will be encouraged to undertake the self assessment process to demonstrate they the meet the Participation Standards in all their work with children and young people.

A new Charter will also be developed by the working group, based on the three underpinning pillars of the UNCRC addressing Protection, Provision and Participation, and will be open to all organisations working with children and young

## Carmarthenshire Youth Forum

### **Children's Rights Promise**

Children across Carmarthenshire are being promised that their rights will be honoured and considered in decision making.

We met with Senior councillors and officers to have this pledge signed, that will ensure the council meets minimum standards when making decisions that affect our lives as Children & Young People.

It also means that decisions will be considered by trained young people on an annual basis.

Brittany Alsop-Bingham, our chairperson, along with Leader Cllr Emlyn Dole, Education Executive Board Member Cllr Gareth Jones, Chief Executive Mark James, Director for Education and Children's Services Rob Sully all signed the promise in advance of Children's Rights Day, November 20.

It was adopted by the county council last year and has been a priority since, with a three-year strategy and action plan being developed.

It included establishing a new Participation and Children's Rights team, a growing Carmarthenshire Youth Council and more opportunities for young people to be involved in decision making processes both locally and nationally.

### **Youth Conference**

Young people across Carmarthenshire gave their views on what was important to them to help shape the future of the county.

Our Youth Conference this year gave Young People the opportunity to share their views on health and well-being, which will be fed into Carmarthenshire's Wellbeing plan, being produced by the new Public Services Board.

Well-being covers topics such as education, the environment, safety, health, jobs, the economy and all matters young people need to be happy, healthy and successful.

A number of workshops took place at the conference and members of the Public Services Board (PSB) were in attendance to give advice and receive feedback.

Our Chairperson Brittany Bingham, 19, said: "I hope the Future Generations Act will have an impact on not just Wales today but on our future in Carmarthenshire, for every generation to come after us.

Executive board member for youth services Cllr Gareth Jones said: "Feedback from the Youth Conference will feed into our well-being plan, it is vitally important that the views of young people are included in any future decision-making."

## Army defies child rights campaigners and intensifies intake of 16 year olds

Figures released today [24 November] show the British Army has increased its intake of 16 year olds over the past twelve months.

The British Army has defied calls from the United Nations, children's rights organisations and others campaigning for the end of the recruitment of minors and increased its intake of 16 year olds. Between September 2015 and September 2016 the Army enlisted 1000 16 year olds, accounting for 13% of the total intake, compared with 870 recruits aged 16 in 2014-15. The recruitment policies used by the Army state that the recruitment of minors is 'an opportunity to mitigate Standard Entry [adult] shortfalls, particularly for the Infantry'. The Infantry has the highest fatality and injury rate of any major branch of the armed forces. Infantrymen in Afghanistan are seven times more likely to be killed than personnel serving in the rest of the British armed forces.

In June 2016, the UN Committee on the Rights of the Child condemned the British Army's safeguards for ensuring informed consent of child recruits and their parents as insufficient and, as a result, called on the UK to raise the age of enlistment to 18 years.

## Cyfle Cymru

### What is Cyfle Cymru?

Cyfle Cymru is a service which helps people with substance misuse issues and/or mental health conditions who are in recovery or are towards the end of their treatment programme into work, education or training.

The project has been funded for an initial 2 years by the European Social Fund and is delivered by members of DACW (Developing a Caring Wales) in North Wales, Gwent, Dyfed, Western Bay and Powys.

Cyfle Cymru provides the support needed to find the right job, training opportunity or qualifications.

It offers:

- one-to-one guidance from a peer mentor who can draw on their own experience of substance misuse, recovery and/or mental health conditions.
- specialist employment support, including volunteering opportunities, and help and advice on how to search and apply for jobs

## Young people living with self-harm find a "Buddy" in new support and advice website

Young people from Monmouthshire and health professionals have developed a valuable website offering support and advice for those living with self-harm. Entitled Buddy, the new resource meets a need for an online outlet offering information, guidance, therapeutic tools and options that young people can access at all times. It provides confidential support and techniques to help deal with negative thoughts and feelings associated with self-harm and reassures those experiencing difficult times that they are not alone.

The Buddy website was launched at Abergavenny's King Henry VIII School on Friday 18th November in association with International Men's Day which took place the following day. The theme of this year's annual international event is Stop Male Suicide and its aim is to raise awareness of mental health issues affecting men. Staff from Monmouthshire's Youth Service delivered a workshop to pupils to focus on

the importance of talking about their feelings and the impact of mental health and male suicide.

Buddy hopes to break down barriers associated with the sensitive subject of self-harm and to help people talk openly, making them aware of ways of coping, available options and accessing support when they feel able to do so. The website has been designed as a response to an increase in self-harming behaviour by young people evidenced by health, education and counselling professionals in recent years. The website has been supported by not-for-profit organisation Heads Above the Waves which raises awareness of depression and self-harm in young people have provided personal accounts and stories for the site.
