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## ***Pleidlais Gwneud Eich Marc yn holi pobl ifanc am eu blaenoriaethau ar gyfer Senedd Ieuenctid y DU***

Mae pleidlais Gwneud Eich Marc / Make Your Mark ar gyfer trafodaeth flynyddol Senedd Ieuenctid y DU wedi cael ei lansio heddiw, 22 Awst 2018.

Gwneud Eich Marc yw'r ymgynghoriad mwyaf yn Ewrop â phobl ifanc. Mae'n rhoi'r cyfle i bobl ifanc 11-18 oed ym mhob rhan o'r DU gymryd rhan a lleisio'u barn drwy helpu i benderfynu beth ddylai aelodau Senedd Ieuenctid y DU ei drafod a phleidleisio amdano fel eu hymgyrch ar gyfer 2019.

Bydd Aelodau'r Senedd Ieuenctid, sydd rhwng 11 a 18 oed, yn cymryd rhan mewn trafodaeth flynyddol yn siambr Ty'r Cyffredin, dan gadeiryddiaeth Llefarydd Ty'r Cyffredin. Byddant yn trafod pum mater a ddewiswyd drwy bleidlais ymhlith pobl ifanc o bob rhan o'r DU, sef Gwneud Eich Marc, ac yna'n pleidleisio i benderfynu pa ddau fater i'w dewis fel prif ymgyrchoedd Senedd Ieuenctid y DU ar gyfer y flwyddyn i ddod.

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## ***Ymgyrch Gorllewin Gwyllt yr NSPCC yn cynnal arolwg o'r risgiau mae plant a phobl ifanc yn eu hwynebu ar-lein***

Mae ymgyrch diogelwch ar-lein yr NSPCC, sy'n galw ar Lywodraeth y Deyrnas Unedig i reoleiddio rhwydweithiau cymdeithasol, wedi cynhyrchu gwaith ymchwil ar y risgiau mae plant a phobl ifanc yn eu hwynebu.

Bu'r arolwg yn holi bron 40,000 o blant 7-16 oed ar draws y Deyrnas Unedig am eu gweithgareddau ar-lein.

Canfu'r NSPCC fod llun o oedolyn noeth neu hanner noeth wedi cael ei anfon neu ei ddangos i 1 o bob 25 plentyn oed cynradd, ar gyfartaledd. Roedd hyn yn codi i 1 o bob 20 ymhlith y plant oed uwchradd.

Mae Ysgrifennydd y Cabinet dros Addysg, Kirsty Williams AC, wedi llongyfarch y disgyblion a gafodd eu canlyniadau TGAU, Safon Uwch a Bagloriaeth Cymru ym mis Awst.

Mae nifer y disgyblion a gafodd raddau A\*-A wedi codi o 17.9% y llynedd i 18.5% eleni. Gwelwyd y nifer uchaf o ddisgyblion yn cael graddau A\* mewn Safon Uwch ers 2010, sef 8.7%.

Ar ddiwrnod y canlyniadau Safon Uwch, yn siarad yn Ysgol Gyfun Gymraeg Glantaf, dywedodd Ysgrifennydd y Cabinet:

"Heddiw yw penllanw llawer o waith caled gan ein myfyrwyr, ac rwyf am eu llongyfarch nhw, yn ogystal â'n hathrawon a'n darlithwyr gwych, ar y canlyniadau hyn.

"Rydyn ni'n gweld set gadarnhaol a sefydlog iawn o ganlyniadau, gyda rhai arwyddion calonogol o gynnydd wrth i ni barhau ar ein taith i ddiwygio addysg."

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## ***Make your Mark ballot asks young people about their priorities for the UK Youth Parliament***

The Make Your Mark ballot for the UK Youth Parliament's annual debate has been launched today, 22 August 2018.

Make Your Mark is the largest consultation of young people in Europe. It gives young people aged 11-18 across the UK the chance to get involved and have their voices heard by helping to decide what Members of the UK Youth Parliament should debate and vote on to be their campaign for in 2019.

Members of Youth Parliament aged 11-18 take part in an annual debate in the House of Commons chamber, chaired by the Speaker of the House of Commons. They debate five issues chosen by the Make Your Mark ballot of young people from across the UK, and then vote to decide which two issues should become the UK Youth Parliament's priority campaigns for the year ahead.

Ballot papers for Make Your Mark are issued through schools, colleges, youth groups, along with partner organisations.

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## **Chair of the Interim Youth Work Board for Wales launches survey to include children and young people in design of new youth work strategy**

Keith Towler, Chair of the Interim Youth Work Board for Wales has announced that he will launch a Wales wide survey on the state of youth work in Wales.

The aim of the survey is to give young people an early chance to say what they value and what they want from youth work in Wales.

The job of the Interim Youth Work Board for Wales is to advise Welsh Government on making, using, and watching over a youth work plan. This plan will help make sure that young people in Wales can use the youth work services they are entitled to.

The Chair notes that it is important that children and young people are a part of designing the new plan from the start.

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## ***NSPCC Wild West Campaign surveys risks children and young people face online***

The NSPCC online safety campaign calling on the UK Government to regulate social networks has produced research into the risks faced by children and young people.

Surveying nearly 40,000 children across the UK, aged 7 to 16, the survey asked about activity online.

NSPCC found that on average 1 in 25 primary school children had been sent or shown a naked or semi-naked image by an adult. This was one in 20 among secondary school children.

1 in 20 primary school children had been sent a naked or semi-naked image by another young person.

The NSPCC, concerned about the scale and impact of sharing intimate images of themselves online and are calling for the government to regulate social network sites.

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***Cabinet Secretary for Education Congratulates GCSE, A-***

## Level and Welsh Baccalaureate students in Wales

The Cabinet Secretary for Education, Kirsty Williams AM, has congratulated pupils receiving their GCSE, A-Level and Welsh Baccalaureate results this August.

The number of pupils getting A\*-A grades has increased from 17.9% last year to 18.5% this year. The number of pupils getting A\* results at A-Level is the best since 2010, at 8.7%.

Speaking at Ysgol Gyfun Gymraeg Glantaf, on the day of the A-Level results, the Cabinet Secretary said:

"Today is the culmination of a lot of hard work from our students and I want to congratulate them, as well as our fantastic teachers and lecturers, on these results.

"We're seeing a very positive and stable set of results, with some very encouraging signs of progress as we continue on our journey of education reform."
