Gwaith ar y Datganiad Ansawdd Blynyddol yn ennill gwobr genedlaethol

Mae Plant yng Nghymru, ar y cyd â lechyd Cyhoeddus Cymru, wedi ennill y categori ar gyfer bod yn Hyrwyddwyr i'r Cyhoedd yng Ngwobrau Cenedlaethol Rhwydwaith Profiad y Claf eleni (PENNA).

PENNA yw'r raglen wobrwyo gyntaf, a'r unig un i gydnabod arfer gorau o ran profiad o ofal ar draws maes iechyd a gofal cymdeithasol yn y Deyrnas Unedig.

Rhoddwyd y wobwr i Plant yng Nghymru a lechyd Cyhoeddus Cymru yn dilyn ein gwaith yn creu fersiwn pobl ifanc o Ddatganiad Ansawdd Blynyddol lechyd Cyhoeddus Cymru.

Fel rhan o Cymru Ifanc, ein menter gyfranogiad, bu Plant yng Nghymru yn gweithio gyda lechyd Cyhoeddus Cymru i gefnogi grwp o bobl ifanc 13-22 oed i fynychu digwyddiad preswyl dau ddiwrnod yng Nghaerdydd.

Roedd y digwyddiad preswyl yn gyfle i grwp Cymru gyfan o bobl ifanc dynnu sylw at faterion iechyd cyhoeddus allweddol, derbyn hyfforddiant cyfathrebu, ysgrifennu storiâu ar gyfer y Datganiad Ansawdd Blynyddol i Bobl Ifanc, a gweithio gyda dylunwyr i ddylanwadu ar ffurf a golwg y ddogfen.

Yn ystod y ddau ddiwrnod, bu'r bobl ifanc yn rhannu barn ac yn cefnogi gwaith i ddatblygu gwefan lechyd Cyhoeddus Cymru, y strategaeth newydd 10 mlynedd, ac amcanion llesiant lechyd Cyhoeddus Cymru.

Amddiffynwyr Hawliau Dynol Plant yn ymateb i ymgynghoriad y Diwrnod Trafod Cyffredinol

Cyn y Diwrnod Trafod Cyffredinol, mae Plant yng Nghymru wedi cyhoeddi ymateb i ymgynghoriad Child Rights Connect (CRC) ar Amddiffynwyr Hawliau Dynol Plant.

Yr ymgynghoriad, sef '*The Views, Perspectives and Recommendations of Children Across the World*' fydd y prif destun trafod ar y diwrnod. Mae'n crynhoi ymatebion plant a phobl ifanc, gan gynnwys plant a phobl ifanc o Gymru.

Bu Plant yng Nghymru'n gweithio gyda phobl ifanc i gael eu barn ar amddiffynwyr hawliau dynol plant. Gellir darllen eu sylwadau yn ein hadroddiad cysylltiedig, a gyhoeddir heddiw. Roedd ystod eang o bynciau trafod, gyda chyfraniadau gan amrywiaeth o grwpiau.

Darparodd pobl ifanc sydd â phrofiad o ofal sylwadau ar y bobl y maen nhw'n eu gweld fel amddiffynwyr hawliau dynol, a'r hawliau oedd yn bwysig iddyn nhw, a rhannwyd stori Joe am sefyll i fyny dros ei hawliau pan roddwyd llety anaddas iddo.

Cychwynwyd y prosiect trawsnewidwyr gan grwp o bobl ifanc â salwch cyfyngus parhaol a'r gobaiith yw cefnogi ac amddiffyn hawliau pobl ifanc sy'n pontio o wasanaethau plant i wasanaethau oedolion. Rhoesant eu barn ar yr hyn sy'n atal diogelu hawliau, beth allai ddigwydd os na fydd hawliau'n cael eu parchu a sut y gall plant helpu i amddiffyn hawliau.

Trwy ein prosiect Ymwneud Mwy â Gofal Cymdeithasol, bu Plant yng Nghymru yn ymgynghori hefyd â grwpiau o blant a phobl ifanc sydd ag anableddau dysgu, gan weithio gyda SAFE (Sexual Awareness For Everyone), a chyda Vale Youth Speak Up. Rhoesant eu barn ar amddiffynwyr hawliau dynol plant, o'r hyn y gallant ei wneud i amddiffyn hawliau, i'w hymdrechion i hyrwyddo Confensiwn y Cenhedloedd Unedig ar Hawliau'r Plentyn trwy ysgolion.

Yn ogystal, mae'r adroddiad yn cynnig argymhellion i helpu i hyrwyddo hawliau plant ymhellach. Ymhlith eraill, awgrymodd pobl ifanc y gellid gwneud y broses adrodd ar Gonfensiwn y Cenhedloedd Unedig ar Hawliau'r Plentyn yn fwy hygyrch i blant a rhoi rôl iddynt petai'r broses yn cael ei hadolygu. Awgrymodd yr adroddiad hefyd y gellid dileu'r rhwystrau sy'n wynebu amddiffynwyr hawliau dynol plant trwy wneud gwybodaeth yn fwy hygyrch.

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Registration open for Young Wales Brexit Question Time

Young people aged 10 to 20 are able to register to put their questions to a panel of experts on the 24th October 2018, at the Senedd in Cardiff Bay.

The event will be chaired by James Williams, BBC Cymru Wales' Brexit correspondent, and questions will be put to a panellists with a range of expertise, with one more panellist to be confirmed:

- **Meri Huws**, Welsh Language Commissioner
- **Ruth Coombs**, Head of Wales, Equality & Human Rights Commission
- **Mari Arthur**, Director of Cynnal Cymru/ Sustain Wales

We want to know what is important to young people about Wales, the European Union and Brexit. It's an opportunity for children and young people to ask about Brexit, about how it might affect travelling and studying in the UK, or rights and equality in Wales after Brexit, or farming and food production, or safe and happy communities.

Questions need to be submitted in advance; this way we can group similar questions together and make sure that as many different questions are answered as possible on the night.

Work on Annual Quality Statement wins national award

Children in Wales with Public Health Wales have won the Championing the Public category at this year's Patient Experience Network National Awards (PENNA).

PENNA is the first and only awards programme to recognise best practice in the experience of care across health and social care in the UK.

The award was given to Children in Wales and Public Health Wales following our work creating the young person's version of Public Health Wales' Annual Quality Statement.

As part of Young Wales, our participation initiative, Children in Wales worked with Public Health Wales to support a group of young people aged 13-22 years old to

attend a two day residential event in Cardiff.

The residential presented an opportunity for an all Wales group of young people to highlight key public health issues, receive communication training, write stories for the Young Person's Annual Quality Statement and work with designers to shape the way the document looks.

Over the two days, the young people shared their views and supported work on developing the Public Health Wales website, the new 10 year strategy and the Public Health Wales well-being objectives.

We're delighted that this work has been recognised with the award, and we look forward to continuing to ensure that young people's voices are heard in the areas of public health.

Children Human Rights Defenders in Wales respond to United Nations Day of General Discussion consultation

In advance of the United Nations Day of General Discussion, Children in Wales has published a response to the Child Rights Connect, (CRC) consultation on Children Human Rights Defenders.

The consultation, 'The Views, Perspectives and Recommendations of Children Across the World' will form the main discussion on the day. It summarises the responses of children and young people, including those from Wales.

Children in Wales worked with young people to collect their views as children human rights defenders. Their views can be read in full in our accompanying report, published today.

There was a wide range of topics, with input from a variety of groups.

Care experienced young people provided insights about who they see as human rights defenders, what rights were important to them, and shared Joe's story about standing up for his rights when he was given unsuitable accommodation.

The transformers project was started by a group of young people with lifelong limiting illnesses and hopes to support and defend the rights of young people going through transition from child to adult services. They gave their views on what stops rights being protected, what might happen if they aren't respected and how children can help to defend rights.

Through our Getting More Involved with Social Care Project, Children in Wales also consulted with groups of children and young people with learning disabilities, with Sexual Awareness For Everyone (SAFE), and with Vale Youth Speak Up. They provided their views on children's human rights defenders, from what they can do to defend rights to their efforts to promote the UNCRC through schools.

The report also makes recommendations to help further promote children's rights. Amongst others, young people suggested that the UNCRC reporting process be made more accessible to children and involve them if the process was reviewed. It also suggested that barriers to becoming children human rights defenders could be lifted by making information more accessible.
